Friday saw hundreds of people flock to Onley Grounds Equestrian Centre for Day 1 of the Championships, all eyes were on Dylan Osborne's Grand National course, a challenging fast and furious course which tested dogs and handlers with a multitude of twists, turns and hidden traps.



Saturday saw the final qualification rounds for the evening's finals, with competitors trying to get round each course in the quickest time with the least amount of faults, the top 20 in each height were invited to the final to battle it out to become British Agility Champions 2023. The day ran into the evening for the finals, the atmosphere was electric with everyone cheering on their team mates, we even saw sparkly pompoms going wild from the balcony from some very enthusiastic cheerleaders. Our winners won some amazing prizes including a lifetime subscription of YuMOVE for their dog.

Sunday held the final round of the Grandnational ahead of the finals and the Juniors time to shine.

The Grand National, sponsored by Naylor's Agility Tunnels saw 8 competitors from each height category battle it out for the Grand national title, unlike the main competition which is split into grade specific courses the Grand national is open to any level dog who all run the same course. This is always a fast, open course with competitors showing off their handling skills to get around the course in the quickest time possible. Our winners won a Naylor's Agility Tunnel.



Our 37 Junior competitors also battled it out over two rounds, 1 Agility and 1 Jumping to be crowned Champion. Alongside the Championships all Juniors were battling it out to try and win a spot on the England team for the World Agility Open Championships in May 2024.
